Helping Franklin County Pet Owners

OUR MISSION

The SPCA of Franklin County is a non-profit organization. Driven by a need to lower the numbers of animals euthanized at the Franklin County Animal Control Shelter, the SPCA of Franklin County was formed in 2003. At the same time we also wanted to help other rescues and shelters across the state by providing a resource that would allow them to work with others in their county or city with the same goals. Our North Carolina Animal Welfare Directory was born. However our main goal is to reduce animal over population in Franklin County through spay & neuter education and services.

FACTS ABOUT PET OVERPOPULATION

- An unspayed cat can produce 4-5 litters a year of 1-6 kittens in each litter.
- An unspayed dog can produce 1-2 litters a year of 1-10 puppies in each litter.
- Fifty thousand kittens and puppies are born every day in our country.
- Only one in nine of these animals will find a home.

BENEFITS OF SPAYING & NEUTERING

- Spayed or neutered pets tend to live an average of 2-3 years longer.
- Spaying and neutering protects pets from some types of cancer.
- Spaying and neutering reduces the chance of pets running away or fighting.
- Dogs who have NOT been spayed or neutered are three times more likely to bite.

SNIP FUND

The SPCA of FC now offers a financial assistance program for qualified low-income pet owners. The co-payment is \$20 cash for cats and \$35 for dogs. The SPCA of FC funds the remaining fees through donations and grants.

The co-payment is due the morning of surgery and will include routine spay or neuter surgery, pain medication, rabies and distemper vaccinations and microchip.

WHO QUALIFIES

Because our funds are very limited for this program, a pet owner must fill out an application and provide proof of financial need in order to qualify for the SNIP Fund. Participation in public assistance programs and household income levels are considered.

Other proof of financial need will be considered on a case-by-case basis. We reserve the right to limit the number of pets sterilized in any one household.
